Overnight stay at Araliya Red.



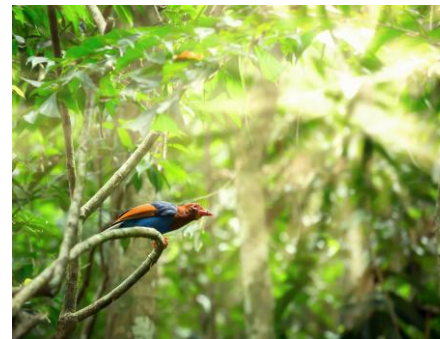
Day 04 | Nuwara Eliya / Gal Oya
