

Day 01 | Colombo International Airport/ Colombo

Day 02 | Colombo / Mirissa



Mirissa is one of the popular beaches on the island as part of the Sri Lanka Tour. The beach of Mirissa was the first beach found by tourists in Sri Lanka. These include snorkeling, scuba diving, whale watching, swimming in the ocean and glass boats for adventure travelers.

Day 03 | Mirissa



Final leg of the Big five experience is the whale watching expedition to get a glimpse of the Blue Whale and the Sperm Whale. Just off the coast of south Sri Lanka, the jewel in the Indian Ocean, swims the majestic blue whale, the largest creature on earth.

Nowhere in the world is it possible to see these ocean giants so close to shore. Your whale watching guide will talk to you about the whale experience in Sri Lanka, the marine lifestyle, the conservation of the same and help you see these creatures in the wild as they are meant to be seen. Day 04 | Mirissa / Hambantota / Yala



Enjoys a Yala national park jeep safari.

Yala is Sri Lanka's most famous national park. Forming a total area of 1268 sq. km of scrub, light forest, grassy plains and brackish lagoons, it's very rich in wildlife and you're virtually certain to encounter elephants, crocodiles, buffaloes and monkeys.

The highlight of a successful safari in Yala is the sight of the Sri Lankan Leopard: very elusive yet such a majestic sight.

Day 05 | Yala / Udawalawa



After getting a morning packed breakfast check out from the hotel and transfer to Yala national park and enjoy a jeep safari at 0600hrs.

Thereafter, transfer to Udawalwe and visit the Elephants Transit home.

Udawalawe Elephant transits home (ETH), also called udawalawe elephant orphanage. The primary purpose of the Elephant Transit Home is to rehabilitate and release isolated baby elephants into the wild. The Ministry of Wildlife Conservation took an essential step in the welfare and protection of orphan elephants in 1995. As a result, “Ath Athuru Sevana” (Elephant Transit Home) was established at the Udawalawe National Park. Elephant Transit Home (ETH) cares for orphaned elephant calves until they are independent and capable enough to be released back into the wild. Although most of the public enthusiastically supported this effort, at first, many conservationists doubted its viability.

Overnight stay at Grand Udawalawe Safari Resort or Maya Tangalle.



Day 06 | Udawalawa / Galle / Negombo

After getting a morning packed breakfast, transfer to the Udawalwe national park and enjoy a jeep safari at 0600hrs.



Udawalawe National Park lies on the boundary of Sabaragamuwa and Uva Provinces, in Sri Lanka. The national park was created to provide a sanctuary for wild animals displaced by the construction of the Udawalawe Reservoir on the Walawe River, as well as to protect the catchment of the reservoir. The reserve covers 30,821 hectares (119.00 sq. mi) of land area and was established on 30 June 1972. Before the designation of the national park, the area was used for shifting cultivation (chena farming). The farmers were gradually removed once the national park was declared. The park is 165 kilometres (103 mi) from Colombo. Udawalawe is an important habitat for water birds and Sri Lankan elephants. It is a popular tourist destination and the third most visited park in the country.

En route visit Galle. Galle is a historical jewel to Sri Lanka wonderful to explore on foot. Among the endlessly exotic old trading port blessed with imposing Dutch-colonial buildings, ancient mosques and churches, grand mansions and museums the ancient Dutch fort which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site attracts the hearts of tourists. Stroll around the ancient city where you will find a gourmet of fancy restaurants and coffee shop to chill and relax. The beach side is surely bliss which will make you want to lock yourself up on this sun-kissed island and indulge in the sea breeze and endless blue waters.

Overnight stay at Heritage Negombo.



Day 07 | Negombo / Airport (Departure)



After breakfast check out from the hotel and transfer to the International Airport to connect with your departure flight.
