Day 02 | Waikkala/ Anuradhapura/ Sigiriya

After Breakfast at the hotel. Proceed to Anuradhapura.



Commence city tour in Anuradhapura including, Ruwanweliseya, Thuparamaya, Jashrimahabodhiya Anuradhapura is the capital of Sri Lanka from the 05th Century B.C. to the end of the 10th Century A.D. was the most celebrated of Sri Lanka's ancient, ruined cities. The city's greatest treasures are its dagobas, which are constructed of bricks and are hemispherical in shape. The most notable of these dagobas are the Ruvanveliseya dating back to the 2nd Century B.C. and is 300 feet in diameter, the Jetawanarama is 370 feet and one of the largest structures in the ancient world. Thuparama Dagoba is enshrined with the collarbone of the Buddha. The city's most renowned relic is the sacred Bo Tree, which is said to have grown from a branch of the tree under which the Buddha gained Enlightenment. It was planted 2250 years ago and is the oldest historically authenticated tree in the world. Anuradhapura is a "UNESCO World Heritage Site.

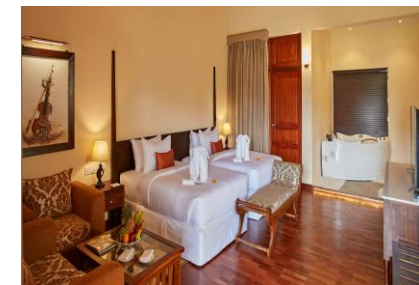
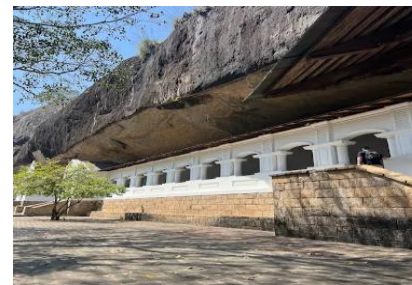
Day 03 | Sigiriya/ Dambulla



Sigiriya, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is a breathtaking 5th-century “Fortress in the Sky” and one of Sri Lanka’s most incredible wonders. Often called Lion Rock, this majestic site features the remnants of a grand royal palace perched atop a towering 600-foot rock. At the summit, you’ll find the foundations of the ancient palace, water tanks, and guardhouses. The journey up Sigiriya reveals a treasure trove of historical marvels, including stunning frescoes of 21 life-sized damsels, the only surviving examples of ancient Sinhala secular painting. Don’t miss the enchanting Water Gardens, Fountain Garden, Summerhouses, Boulder Gardens, and the intriguing caves scattered throughout the site. Sigiriya promises an unforgettable exploration of history, art, and architectural grandeur amidst stunning natural beauty. Afterwards Visit Dambulla Cave Temple.

Explore the Dambulla Cave Temples, an ancient site with a striking 500-foot rock formation. Dating back to the First Century B.C., these caves sheltered King Walagamba during his exile, and he later built this remarkable temple complex. Highlights include the 47-foot-long recumbent Buddha in the first cave, adorned with ancient frescoes, and the grand second cave, featuring 150 life-size Buddha statues and vibrant frescoes depicting key events in Buddha’s life and Sinhalese history. Discover this blend of historical grandeur and spiritual artistry.

Minneriya National Park in Sri Lanka is famous for “The Gathering,” where hundreds of wild elephants come to the Minneriya Reservoir during the dry season (July–October) — the largest meeting of Asian elephants in the world. The park also has rich biodiversity, including deer, leopards, monkeys, and many bird species. Its scenic landscapes, centered around the ancient Minneriya Tank, and exciting jeep safaris make it a top destination for wildlife viewing and photography.

Day 05 | Sigiriya/ Passikuda



Hot air ballooning in Kandalama, near Dambulla, offers a stunning sunrise flight over lakes, forests, villages, and landmarks like Sigiriya. The ride lasts about 1 hour, with the full experience taking 3–4 hours. It's best from November to April, when skies are clear and the tour ends with a champagne breakfast after landing

Passikudah is picturesque fishing village located in the lagoon enclosed region of the east coast of Sri Lanka. It is budding as a popular tourist destination with the emergence of many modern hotels. The soft, sandy beach is perfect for sunbathing, and the bay is ideal for wind surfing. Passikudah is also characterized by a shallow fringing coral reef towards the outer bay which protects the inner line of the bay. It is one of the best-known reef systems in the east. The turquoise blue waters of the bay attract local and foreign tourists to this wide sandy place under the hot tropical sun to surf, swim or just frolic in the water. Many other activities are available from kite surfing, boogie boarding to surfing and sailing across a canoeing.

They offer guided tours through crops like pepper, nutmeg, cinnamon, and cardamom, as well as medicinal herbs. Many locations provide educational and cultural experience, often including a tasting of fresh juices or a farm-to-table meal. Proceed to Kandy. Commence city tour in Kandy including, Kandy upper lake view, Gem Shop, Local Market & Evening enjoy Kandy cultural Dance Show.

The Kandy Cultural Dance Show is a captivating showcase of Sri Lankan heritage set in the historic city of Kandy. In evening visit Kandy temple and end the day. The Sri Dalada Maligawa, known as the Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic, is a revered Buddhist temple in Kandy, Sri Lanka. Situated within the royal palace complex, it enshrines the Relic of the tooth of Buddha. This relic has historically held significant political influence, as it is believed that possession of the relic symbolizes governance over the country. Kandy, once the capital of the Sinhalese kings, preserves this heritage, contributing to its UNESCO World Heritage site status, primarily due to the cultural and religious importance of the temple and its relic.

Day 08 | Kandy/ Nuwara Eliya/ Koslanda

Nestled in the lush Pussellawa area along the A5 highway, this spectacular 109-meter-high waterfall promises an unforgettable experience. With its majestic cascade from 945 meters above sea level, Ramboda Falls offers panoramic views and a serene escape into nature. Whether you're a nature enthusiast or a photography lover, this enchanting waterfall is a must-visit destination that will leave you in awe.

Nuwara Eliya tea factories are often historic buildings located in a high-altitude region known for producing teas with a delicate, fragrant flavor and a pale, golden hue. Visitors can tour these factories to see the traditional tea-making process, which includes withering, rolling, fermenting, and grading the leaves, while experiencing the colonial-era ambiance and scenic views of the tea plantations. Many factories offer tea tasting and retail shops, with some even providing hands-on experiences like tea plucking.

Little Adam's Peak is a popular, relatively easy hike in [Ella, Sri Lanka](#), known for its stunning views and resemblance to the sacred Adam's Peak. The trail, which takes about 1-2 hours round trip, winds through tea plantations and leads to a summit with panoramic views of the Ella Valley, including Ella Gap and Ella Rock. It's recommended for sunrise or sunset, though you should be mindful of footing and crowds.

Yala National Park is Sri Lanka's second largest and most visited national park, located in the southeast, known for its high density of leopards and diverse ecosystems including forests, grasslands, and lagoons. It is a major wildlife sanctuary with abundant elephants, sloth bears, and over 215 bird species. Visitors can explore the park, which includes ancient ruins and pilgrimage sites, during its opening hours, with the best time to visit being the dry season from February to June.

The Mulkirigala Rock Temple ([Mulkirigala Raja Maha Viharaya](#)) is a 3rd century BC ancient Buddhist complex in Sri Lanka carved into a massive, 673-foot tall rock. It features seven cave shrines with vibrant frescoes, numerous Buddha statues, and a stupa, all spread across five terraces. The ascent through the temple is steep, but the summit offers panoramic views of the surrounding landscape.

[Cookery demonstration](#) is a hands-on experience where participants learn to cook traditional Sri Lankan cuisine through interactive classes, often including a market tour to select fresh ingredients. Participants typically cook several dishes, such as vegetable and meat curries and You will visit a nearby village home for an authentic Sri Lankan cooking experience. On the way, you'll pick fresh vegetables from the fields and buy a few ingredients at the local market, accompanied by your guide. At the village home, a local woman will host the cooking class, guiding you through traditional recipes and techniques. You'll actively participate in preparing and cooking the dishes, then enjoy the delicious lunch you've made yourself.

Day 14 | Tangalle/ Colombo



Koggala stilt fishermen balance on a vertical pole with a horizontal crossbar, perched a few meters above the water to fish with a hand-held rod and line. This ancient tradition is now a major tourist attraction, requiring immense patience, as fishermen sit for hours, often in the early morning or late afternoon, to catch fish swimming close to the shore. The fisherman's low height keeps them from casting a large shadow, making them less likely to scare the fish.

Afterwards Commence city tour in Galle including, Galle Dutch fort, Clock tower. A Galle city tour is a visit to the historic, coastal city in Sri Lanka, focusing on the UNESCO World Heritage-listed [Galle Fort](#). Tours typically include exploring the fort's colonial architecture, walking along its ramparts, visiting the lighthouse, and browsing local shops and the Old Dutch Hospital. Many tours also include nearby attractions like a sea turtle hatchery, gem museums, and beaches such as Unawatuna. Koggala is a location in Sri Lanka known for its turtle conservation projects, not a specific type of turtle. Sri Lanka is home to five sea turtle species: the [Green turtle](#), [Olive Ridley turtle](#), [Hawksbill turtle](#), [Loggerhead turtle](#), and [Leatherback turtle](#). The Hawksbill turtle is one of the more distinctive species, with a tapered, hawk-like head, a V-shaped lower jaw, and a mottled shell with serrated edges.
